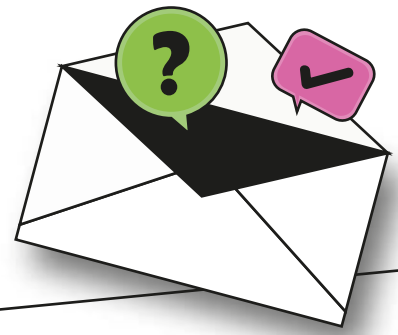

Village Hall News

The Village Hall Committee are delighted to announce that, with the help of a grant from the National Lottery Community Fund, which is celebrating its 25th year, we have been able to replace the old wooden fire doors with some lovely new steel ones. Thank you to all members of the Village Hall team who brought this project to completion, including Ernie Barlow who was always an enthusiastic and supportive member of our team. However, we would mostly like to say a huge THANK YOU to each and everyone of you who have supported our fund-raising efforts – we really could not have done it without YOUR support.



The National Lottery makes an incredible difference to communities across the UK with £30 million going to good causes across the UK each week, so to those of you who do play – we thank you.

The next priority is to replace the floors so that they are not only easier to keep clean but the Hall can be used for activities such as carpet bowls and there will be a more suitable surface for dancing. We are putting the final touches to an application for funding from the Tesco Groundwork scheme and if that goes ahead as we hope, we shall be looking for your support.

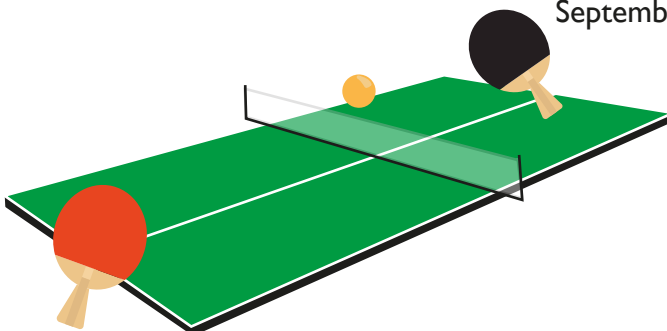
Summer probably isn't an ideal time to hold breakfast mornings, and the next of these will be on Saturday 19th October. Meanwhile, more seasonally, we shall serve cream teas in the Hall on Monday 26th August from 3 to 4.30 pm. Next May will be the 70th Anniversary of VE Day and there will be national celebrations to commemorate the achievement of peace in Europe. Meetings are taking place to arrange events in Mepal and we shall be pleased to host some of these.

You will recall our repeated appeals for younger people to join the Committee and help run the Hall. On average we are past – in many cases well past – retirement age and there are limits to the physical effort we can contribute. This underlines the fact that we can't provide a service of arranging furniture for hirers or putting it away afterwards. In fact most village halls, even if they have plenty of able-bodied helpers, require hirers to arrange their own furniture and put it away, leaving the hall clear. We fully understand that some of our regular user groups, like us, are no longer as young as they were, and don't have anyone fit enough to heave tables about. We are trying to find a workable solution to the problem. Is there anyone in the village who would be willing to help in this sort of practical way without taking on any other responsibility for the Hall? If you are able-bodied and recently retired or working flexible hours that would enable you to help when needed, please get in touch.
